Qualification Purpose	This qualification has been developed in conjunction with the Centre for Innovation in Mathematics Teaching (CIMT). Core Maths has been introduced by the DfE to address the issue of poor progression in mathematics from age 16, by offering an opportunity for students not studying AS or A level mathematics to study a Level 3 mathematics course alongside their main programme of study.

To support centres on top of the additional adaptations already confirmed, we:

 Have updated our <u>special consideration process</u> to accommodate circumstances where students need to self-isolate and cannot attend scheduled assessments. This qualification is in scope for alternative arrangements and if required can be awarded via a teacher assessed grade from the centre.

As the externally assessed components have been cancelled and those components are not also internally assessed, centres should look to evidence performance at a grade via other sources of evidence to inform the teacher assessed grade, such as;

- using additional sample assessments papers
- homework or classwork
- project work
- witness testimonies or teacher observation records
- centre devised assessments
- formative assessments

We will release additional sample assessment papers on our website which centres can use to generate the teacher assessed grade, we will also updated the grade descriptors for Core Maths to support teachers in making a judgement about learners' performance. These are within the qualification specification which can be found on our website here. All updates and sample materials will be available on our website no later than 16 April 2021.

We have worked together with Ofqual, sector partners and other awarding organisations to agree common approaches to setting minimum evidence thresholds for a teacher assessed grade from the centre for this
