External Assessment Brief - Garden

A new restaurant has opened in your area. The restaurant prides itself on using fresh ingredients. It also makes use of flowers and herbs from its own garden.

They intend to sell craft items and have invited ideas for craft items based on any interpretation of the theme **Garden**.

The restaurant will select the best ideas and produce them as craft items which they can put on sale. The restaurant will also display the craft items in the reception area.

You have decided to submit an idea for a craft item to the restaurant.

In this assessment you will need to interpret, research, design and present your ideas in response to the brief. You will produce a project plan to show how you would create your craft item. You do not need to produce your actual craft item.

All of your work throughout this assessment **must** relate to **one** craft area only (eg textiles, ceramics, floristry etc).



Part A

These Tasks must be done under supervised conditions.

Make sure that you separate and label each Task clearly.

These are the Tasks you need to complete in **Part A**:

Task 1

You **must** ensure your work in Task 1 addresses assessment criterion: 1.1. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the Task.

Task 1 has **two** parts that **must** be completed:

- a) State your craft area.
- b) In relation to the craft area, explain the requirements of the craft brief.

Your explanation **must** cover:

- aspects of the theme **Garden** on which you intend to focus
- the creative opportunities that the brief provides
- the challenges that the brief presents.

Your evidence may include for example: sketchbooks, design notes, technical notes, annotated mood boards, annotated photographs, presentation, sketches and a journal.

If your evidence is electronic, it **must** be printed out and securely attached to this External Assessment paper.

It's recommended that you spend around 5 hours on this Task.

You **must** ensure your work in Task 2 addresses assessment criteria: 1.3 and 1.4. You can refer to the assessment criteria on the next page.

Now that you've interpreted the requirements of the brief, you will have some initial ideas. In this Task you will research information from different sources to develop ideas for your craft work.

Task 2 has two parts.

- a) Using your ideas carry out research on the following:
 - research of your own craft ideas within your chosen craft area
 - the techniques that are used in your chosen craft area
 - research of costings within your chosen craft area.

Your research must be broad, using a range of at least three different sources.

Sources may include:

- craft fairs
- books
- magazines
- photographs
- blogs/vlogs
- other people's work
- own work i.e. experimentation of materials and techniques.

Sources may be accessed physically or electronically, i.e. using a hard copy of a book or via the internet by accessing an e-book online.

b) Collate and present the findings from your research to show how you have developed your own craft ideas.

Your evidence may include for example: maquettes, sketchbooks, design notes, technical notes, annotated mood boards, annotated photographs, presentation, worksheets and a journal.

If your evidence is electronic it **must** be printed out and securely attached to this External Assessment paper.

You may consider submitting evidence of practical experimentation of techniques.

Your research of any costs in relation to your craft area will be used in your project plan in **Task 6.**

It's recommended that you spend around **10 hours** on this Task.

You **must** ensure your work in Task 3 addresses assessment criterion: 1.2. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the Task.

In this Task you'll consider your research from Task 2.

Compare and evaluate at least two different craft techniques that you've researched, describing the possibilities and limitations of each.

Your evidence may include for example: maquettes, sketchbooks, design notes, technical notes, annotated mood boards, annotated photographs, presentation, photos, sketches and a journal.

If this evidence is electronic it **must** be printed out and securely attached to this External Assessment paper.

You should keep further notes of any costs involved in this Task. You'll need them for your project plan in **Task 6.**

It's recommended that you spend around 3 hours on this Task.

Develop a **minimum** of **three** different ideas for possible craft items for the restaurant. Base your ideas on the work you've done in Tasks 2 and Task 3.

Your ideas **must** refer to your researched craft techniques and to the theme of **Garden**.

Your evidence may include, for example: maquettes, sketchbooks, design notes, technical notes, annotated mood boards, annotated photographs, presentation, sketches and a journal.

If your evidence is electronic, it **must** be printed out and securely attached to this External Assessment paper.

You should keep further notes of any costs involved in this Task. You'll need them for your project plan in **Task 6.**

It's recommended that you spend around 6 hours on this Task.

You **must** ensure your work in Task 5 addresses assessment criterion: 1.6. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the Task.

From the work completed so far, select your final idea to submit to the restaurant.

You **must** give reasons for your choice.

Present your final idea in any appropriate format. This could be digitally or in hard copy (i.e. design board or presentation).

Your evidence may include, for example: maquettes, sketchbooks, design notes, technical notes, annotated photographs and sketches.

It's recommended that you spend around 3 hours on this Task.

As you worked through the earlier Tasks you will have kept notes on the costs you expected for your selected craft idea. Using these notes, you will now produce a costed project plan for your final craft item.

Your plan will describe the stages you will go through as you produce your craft item; the order in which these activities will take place, the resources you will require and a detailed breakdown of the costs.

Your evidence may include for example: spreadsheets/worksheets or a presentation.

If your evidence is electronic it **must** be printed out and securely attached to this External Assessment paper.

It's recommended that you spend around 3 hours on this Task.
