Qualification content, structure and outcomes

This qualification enhances your current skills and knowledge as a practitioner to support parents/carers.

It covers a range of topics including:

- supporting families across children and young people provision
- multi-disciplinary work
- engaging parents and carers in the holistic development of children through play.

You will need to complete all **3 mandatory units** that equate to **160 guided learning hours** and **180 total qualification hours**. All units will be internally assessed and graded achieved/not yet achieved.

Upon completion you will have enhanced your knowledge, skills, values and behaviours as a practitioner to support parents/carers growing complex needs and nurture and maintain relationships. You may wish to take on management responsibility in a setting, or work at a more senior level with other agencies.

Similar qualifications

We do not offer any similar qualifications within our portfolio. This is the only qualification for practitioners at Level 4.

Other ways to achieve the same outcome

This qualification is not part of an apprenticeship and does not map to an apprenticeship standard, so you will need to apply for a loan to support you through this qualification.
