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Design Brief

In this assessment you will need to interpret, research and present design ideas in response to the brief. You will then select a final design and produce a costed project plan to show how you would create your craft item.

You **do not** need to produce your actual craft item.

All of your work throughout this assessment must relate to **one** craft area only, for example, textiles, ceramics, floristry etc.

Craft Brief

Fun! Delight! Surprise!

A local Family Centre is opening a new indoor play area for children. The staff want to display craft items around the play area. They have invited you to design a craft item to be put on display. All of the craft items will be out of the reach of children.

The staff want the craft items to communicate the image of the Family Centre which is:

Fun! Delight! Surprise!

It is recommended that you spend around 3 hours on this Task.

You must ensure your work in Task 1 addresses assessment criterion: 1.1. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the Task.

Interpret the requirements of the craft brief. You must:

- describe the requirements of the brief
- analyse the creative opportunities that the brief presents
- explore the creative challenges that the brief presents.

It is recommended that you spend around **5 hours** on this Task.

You **must** ensure your work in Task 2 addresses assessment criteria: 1.3 and 1.4. You can refer to the assessment criteria below the task.

a) Research information using at least 3 different sources to develop ideas for your craft item. Your research must be as detailed as possible.

Sources may include:

- craft fairs
- books
- magazines
- photographs
- blogs/vlogs
- other people's work.

Sources may be accessed physically, for example by using a hard copy of a book, or via the internet, for example by accessing an e-book online.

b) Collate and present the findings from your research. Clearly and in detail show how these will inform your own craft ideas.

It is recommended that you spend around **7 hours** on this Task.

You must ensure your work in Task 3 addresses assessment criterion: 1.2. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the Task.

- a) Carry out practical experimentation with craft techniques for your chosen craft area.
- **b)** Compare and evaluate at **least two** different craft techniques that you have experimented with.
- c) Describe the possibilities and limitations of each technique.
- **d)** Explain which techniques you would use to make your craft item and justify why you have chosen these techniques.
- **e)** Research the costs of the materials, tools and techniques you would need to use to make your craft item.

It is recommended that you spend around 8 hours on this Task.

You **must** ensure your work in Task 4 addresses assessment criterion: 1.5. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the Task.

- a) Develop at least three different craft ideas in response to the brief 'Fun! Delight! Surprise!' Your craft ideas must be developed in detail.
- **b)** Annotate your craft ideas to show how they meet the brief.

You must base your craft ideas on the work you have completed in Tasks 1, 2 and 3.

From the work you've completed, select and present the final idea that will be submitted to the Family Centre.

You must:

- present your final idea using any appropriate physical or digital format
- provide thorough and detailed reasons for your choice of idea.

It is recommended that you spend around 3 hours on this Task.

You must ensure your work in Task 6 addresses assessment criterion: 1.7. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the Task.

Using your research of costings from Task 3, produce a detailed and fully costed project plan for your final craft item.

Your project plan **must** include:

- the stages of creating your craft item
- the materials and tools you would need to make your craft item
- a breakdown of the costs to create your craft item.
