### Why choose these qualifications?

- Our Level 2 Certificate and Extended Diploma in Health and Social Care will be launching in September 2016 and will provide progression onto our Level 3 Extended Diploma (see overleaf)

- The Certificate is nested within the Extended Diploma and will allow an early "step off" opportunity for learners
- The Extended Diploma can usually be completed in one year

### **Progression and Job Roles**

Learners may progress to Higher Education or to further learning at Level 4 and above. These qualifications do not provide a licence to practise, but may support progression into a range of job roles in the health and social care sector, including:

- Care support workers in adult residential settings
- Healthcare assistants in community, primary care and acute health environments
- Care support workers in domiciliary services, supported living or day services
- Community-based support workers
