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Design Brief

Gifts Direct

Gifts Direct is an exciting new online stationary company. To accompany their Internet launch they are introducing some new products. Their products will be available in the following design themes:

- vintage travel
- black and white
- nautical.

Gifts Direct have commissioned you to develop a graphic design for **ONE** of these themes.

To meet the external factors you **must** demonstrate how your graphic design:

- will appear as a repeat pattern for wrapping paper
- will appear on a gift tag
- will look on a square gift bag.

There are some constraints you must work within:

- you must not use photographs within your illustrations
- your design **must** incorporate the title **Gifts Direct**.

Using one of the themes above for your work, you are required to undertake Tasks 1–4 to develop your ideas and create your final graphic design.

It is recommended that you spend around **12 hours** on this Task.

You must ensure your work in Task 1 addresses assessment criterion: 1.1. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the task.

- **a)** Experiment with a range of graphic design techniques and visual language:
 - · wet or dry media
 - digital design
 - colour, tone, shape, line and texture
 - collage
 - printmaking
 - fonts and typographical layouts.
- b) Use a range of graphic design techniques and visual language to communicate at least 3 ideas that must meet the design brief.

Your 3 ideas **must** be in response to one of the following themes:

- vintage travel
- black and white
- nautical.

The ideas that you submit for this Task **must** be your own, but you may use existing examples as inspiration, such as:

- existing examples of stationary products
- other examples of the creative use of typography.

It is recommended that you spend around 4 hours on this Task.

You **must** ensure your work in Task 2 addresses assessment criterion: 1.2. You can refer to the assessment criterion on the next page.

- a) Produce a **record** of your progress so far. You **must:**
 - show the creative opportunities that the brief presents
 - annotate your ideas in Task 1 to show which ideas will best meet the design brief. You must give reasons for your choice
 - explain why you have rejected some ideas and chosen to develop others.
- **b)** Produce a **plan**. Your plan **must** show:
 - the activities you will do to meet the design brief in the time available
 - the order in which you intend to do these activities
 - the difficulties you think you might come across
 - how you could overcome any concerns or difficulties you may experience
 - the resource requirements.
- **c)** As you work through the tasks, you **must** revisit and update your plan to record:
 - the progress you are making
 - any development notes
 - any difficulties you have come across

You **must** ensure your work in Task 3 addresses assessment criterion: 1.3. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the task.

- a) Using your ideas from Task 1, complete some further experimentation with a range of graphic materials, techniques and equipment to demonstrate their properties.
- **b)** Based on your experimentation select the most appropriate graphic materials, techniques and equipment, suitable for your designs.
- c) State clearly why your selections are appropriate in meeting the design brief.

You **must** ensure your work in Task 4 addresses assessment criterion: 1.4. You can refer to the assessment criterion below the task.

Using your ideas, select and develop your final **graphic design**. Your design **must** show you have worked within the following constraints:

- you **must** not use photographs within your illustrations
- your design must incorporate the title Gifts Direct.

You **must** demonstrate how your design will meet external factors and how it will:

- appear as a repeat pattern for wrapping paper
- appear on a gift tag
- look on a square gift bag.
